In my capacity as a pathologist I conducted a coroners post mortem on Arthur CUNNINGHAM

at Queen Alexandra Hospital on 2/10/98. A death certificate had been issued

which included bronchopneumonia and Parkinson's disease as the cause of death. However, Mr

CUNNINGHAM's stepson disputed these causes and requested a post mortem to which the

Coroner agreed.

I do not recall this post mortem but I produce a Portsmouth Pathology Service Autopsy Report

on the body of Mr CUNNINGHAM exhibit no (YH/1).

The cause of death was bilateral bronchopneumonia.

My remarks are as follows" The deceased suffered from clinical Parkinsonism for several years. This was complicated by dementia which had juperdised management. He had been immobile and bed ridden, and consequently developed a sacral bed ulcer. Immobile and bed ridden patients are also known to be prone to bronchopneumonia, an infection which has led to the death of the deceased. In my opinion death was due to natural causes."

Any disease leading to death is deemed to be a natural cause.

Unnatural causes of death include Homicide, Suicide and Accident.
