No charges for drug deaths GP

O No criminal charges will be brought against the CP at the centre of an investigation into the treaths of hospital patients from overdoses.

Prosecutors have told families that Dr. Jane Barton will not face prosecution for her care of olderly people at Cosport War Memorial Hospital between 1996 and 1999.

The announcement comes despite a General Medical

Council panel limiting her quity of multiple instances of serious professional misconduct relating to 12 patients. Relatives of potients at the Hampshire hospital said they would go to the High Court to seek judicial review of the Crown Prosecution Service decision. An impuest jury had ruled that drugs prescribed by the CP contributed to the deaths of two winner and three mery.
