No charges for drug deaths GP

• No criminal charges will be brought against the GP at the centre of an investigation into the deaths of hospital patients from overdoses.

Prosecutors have told families that Dr Jane Barton will not face prosecution for her care of elderly people at Gosport War Memorial Hospital between 1996 and 1999.

The announcement comes despite a General Medical

Council panel finding her guilty of multiple instances of serious professional misconduct relating to 12 patients.

Relatives of patients at the Hampshire hospital said they would go to the High Court to seek judicial review of the Crown Prosecution Service decision.

An inquest jury had ruled that drugs prescribed by the GP contributed to the deaths of two women and three men.
