Police Involvement

- December 1999 Mrs R's daughter asks police to investigate unlawful killing
- March 1999 CPS decide insufficient evidence to

 October 1999 Police investigation into death of Mrs R reopens. Police

Police Involvement ctd

- April 2001 9 other families approach police following local media coverage
- July 2001 CPS decide again insufficient evidence for prosecution in Ms R's case.
 Police close Mrs R's file
- August 2001 Police investigate deaths of 4 further patients and commission external advice from Dr Munday & Prof. Ford
 Late Aug 2001 Police approach. CHI HARVENER
