CHI started operating on 1st April 2000 & has a programme underway which aims to reduce unacceptable variations in care & ensure that every NHS patient receives a high level of care.

- 3. Project support established to help gather information
- CHI advertise to the general public to come forward for meetings
- CHI contact stake holders i.e. social services / media for their input
- CHI visit planned for Jan 2002 they will be in the hospital for a week.
 There is a deadline of 24 weeks to investigate and provide feedback so will all be over by April.
- They will interview approximately 60 –70 staff who either work on the wards or are part of the MDT.
