Purpose

To review guidance on treatment with medicines and monitor ways in which medicines are managed.

Principal Functions

- 1. Agreeing requirements for treatment/prescribing guidelines for patients in PCT secondary care environment by:
- Identifying current guidelines
- Establishing timetable for audit/review of treatment/prescribing guidelines
- Reviewing pathways for agreement of policy/guidance and agreeing route for communication to interested parties
- 2. Reviewing and approving draft treatment/prescribing guidelines for patients in PCT secondary care environment, in particular:
- Reviewing treatment in 6 key areas by 30th June 2003.
- 3. Reviewing and approving systems for medicines management in PCT secondary care environment.
- Receiving reports of audits of compliance with treatment/prescribing guidelines and assessing prescribing in relation to patient dependency.
- Receiving retrospective audit of diamorphine prescribing on Sultan Ward to ensure current guidelines implemented.
- Agreeing system for routine monitoring and audit of narcotic analgesics including baseline audit of all CD prescribing at GWMH.
- Audit of prescribing and use of medicines with potential for missuse across the health economy.
- Receiving audit of quality and legibility of prescribing to facilitate discussion between medical staff and GPs
- 4. Agreeing training requirements for prescribers as new treatment/prescribing guidelines are developed to ensure integration into PCT training programmes.
