# Request for an internal management report from 1991 examining drug prescribing practices at the hospital.

Hampshire PCT considers that, as this document forms part of the papers for the forthcoming inquests relating to Gosport War Memorial Hospital, its disclosure in the public domain at this stage would be likely to prejudice the administration of justice. Having considered the Public Interest Test the PCT is placing an exemption under Section 31(c) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 where the administration of justice includes inquisitorial processes (such as inquiries and Coroner's courts).

## Request for any subsequent management minutes discussing the report and any action programme.

Hampshire PCT considers that this information was recorded as part of internal investigation and release at this stage would prejudice a fair hearing and, having considered the Public Interest Test is placing an exemption under Section 30(2)(a)(i) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Section 31 "Law enforcement" - (1) (c) "the administration of justice" includes inquisitorial processes (such as inquiries and coroners' courts). The duty to confirm or deny the existence of the information requested is not relevant; however this is not an absolute exemption so we will need to apply the Public Interest Test to demonstrate why disclosure is likely to prejudice the inquest proceedings and a fair conclusion. Section 32 "Court Records" - the information only qualifies here if it is held solely because it is held in one of the court documents, therefore not appropriate.

If you are in agreement with my initial thinking (exemption under Section 31) I will make a start on the Public Interest Test (PIT) which I would usually ask Gareth to sign off before I send the response to the applicant – this would not be released with our decision but I would use the reasoning in the response – however will probably need input from you to identify the likely prejudice.

Dear Sir or Madam
I am writing to make a Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request relating to previous investigations of events at the Gosport War Memorial Hospital.
I am specifically seeking a copy of an internal management report from 1991 examining drug prescribing practices at the hospital. The existence of this document was first publicly made known in 2002 when it was apparently handed to Hampshire police as part of their investigation into a number of deaths at the hospital. At that time (approximately September 2002), the then chief executive of Fareham & Gosport Primary Care Trust, Ian Piper and Tony Horner, then chief executive of East Hampshire Primary Care Trust temporarily stepped down from their positions. I've included that detail in the hope it helps you identify the specific document because I do not know what it was officially called or who commissioned it.
For similar purposes of clarity, the report I am seeking is NOT the Commission for Health Improvement report from July 2002.
I would like a copy of the 1991 report together with any subsequent management minutes discussing the report and any action programme. I would anticipate that these documents would include references to named individuals. If that is likely to cause Data Protection Act problems, I would ask you to redact the names rather than withhold the entire document. I would argue that with the inquests opening shortly into the deaths of ten patients at the hospital which is likely to examine drug prescribing practices on the wards, the balance of the public interest test in favour of releasing this information - even with redactions - outweighs any qualified exemptions you may be considering.
I do not know whether the 1991 report is included in the disclosure bundle for the forthcoming inquests. If it is, I would ask you to provide the report as it is already, or soon will be, in the public domain. That would remove any justification not to release the document. If the report is not in the disclosure bundle, I would urge you to still make a decision in principle about releasing the information. While I have been advised that it is not possible to prejudice inquest proceedings, your organisation may take a different view so the debate would then become about the timing of an FOI publication, perhaps to coincide with the conclusion of the inquests.

Mary has kindly allowed me to review the files relevant to this request. As Mary has pointed out there is no specific "internal management report", however I do think the document referred to is the record of the meeting held in July 1991 which is a formal record of the night nurses concerns. The other documents would be the records and actions that followed on from this meeting.

Having discussed with Mary we feel the release of this information at this time would not be helpful to the forthcoming inquest and am therefore considering relevant exemptions (Kiran – I would particularly welcome your views):
