We know that Mrs McKenzie's response to you was that she did not agree and she referred to practising euthanasia 'REFERRED'

LATER [We have heard that my mother received 45mg of crampoh from dlnchtrie on that day (DHL) until the early hours of the morning.

LATER [It is true Mr Beed to state that my mother having had 45mg of crampoh was unconscious on the morning of 18th August isn't it?

* Do you remember that I asked you to give my mother something for the pain and you gave my mother an injection into her thigh?

Do you remember that a while later because my mother still appeared to be in pain you came in again in the presence of both my sister and I and gave a further injection - is that correct?

Q Do you remember I advised you on this occasion?

Q Did you consider dementia to be a mental health condition? In your police statement you stated that when people have a mental health problem they are regularly given doses of drugs that are much higher than you would normally give to patients
