We have heard in evidence from Mrs Mackenzie that you came into My Mothers room and told her that you would make her more comfortable and give her an injection of morphine (diamorphine) I was not a witness to this as I must presume this was when I left the room to return to Haslem due to my Mothers extreme distress and pain.

However when I returned only a short time later my Mother was still in extreme distress & pain. She had by this time been given Oramorph I did actually speak to you at this time and say words to the effect. Please Philip she is still in pain, for goodness sake can't you give something to alleviate this. A short time later you came and gave an intramuscular rig into her thigh. This had little effect immediately, and because of her continued noise and disturbance to the ward - you came again and gave her a further intramuscular rig - for which I thanked you.

My 5/2 I were both there and I certainly took a syringe when I see one.

- so from AM. 18th she was unable through drugs to take any fluids or nourishment and yet her oral medication was changed to a Syringe drive with a prescription range which was far to high

and rest in the patient's best interest.

My Mother remained continually unconscious. She was totally unconscious from 9.430 am 18th. I tested her myself with the usual methods of the time - reaction to bony stimuli - etc, and there was no reaction. She was not sleeping. She remained totally unresponsive. BUT on moistening her mouth with oral hygiene swabs - (which we provided - having been told they were not available) she readily made suckling movements with her mouth and sucked the swabs which were soaked with water & squash. My eldest daughter - a qualified Nurse - did this on a regular basis and ~~she~~ she did not cough or splutter - she swallowed the liquid. Small amounts obviously ~~and~~ as she was unconscious and we were both very aware of the care we must take with this procedure Mrs Mackenzie and I remained with my Mother until her death.

Apart from reloading the syringe drive - ~~no~~ noises were not present in my Mother's room and no review was made.

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
