you prescribing found to be hazardous + not in best interests of Mrs R

Questions asked by Pera to Dr Barton at Inquest.

17th

①

When Mr Meenan asked questions regarding prescribing you stated that this was not based or influenced on any medication received at RHH.

you said that your decision was based on "any painkiller care patient" not specifically Mrs Richards.

So is it right that you did ^{not} prescribe for Mrs Richards specifically?

not aware of any problems on transfer

Established on 17-18th six doses of Oramorph late being 04:30 - able to swallow
No pain relief until SD started 11:45 on 18th

you said you were not responsible and not concerned with the administration that she was without pain relief for 7 hours.

18th

8:30am mmms present

yet you state in your notes on the one hand the reason for the SD was that Mrs Richards 'still in great pain' - nursing a problem. - reported to her + since given difficulty swallowing to her Oramorph did not feel she was unconscious.

yet you have just stated when the syringe driver was put in place "she was not unconscious - she was peaceful".

↳ did not see her before SD was set up.

17th

②

you stated that Mrs Richards was not going to survive having had hep ~~reduction~~ ^{reduction} at Haverdon 14th - you made that decision

yet she did recover didn't she ^{would you accept for 3 days prior to transfer}
Eating drinking had breakfast on 17th and was fully weight bearing.

17th

you also stated when asked
that the haematoma was "very significant"
to your decision to move to palliative care
on 17th yet you went on to say the existence
of the haematoma was
"another chime of warning"
