Q Can you tell me why there are no comments on my Mother's extract sheet from admission on the 11th - when you stated does not appear in pain, until the 14th - despite the fact that Oxamorph on 11th and 12th and Vandana had deep breathing and unable to take adequate nourishment?

Q We have heard in evidence of my Mother's closed reduction under a IV of 20mg Midazolam and you have, ~~commented~~ <sup>on this occasion made a note on my Mother's contact</sup> order being unresponsive for our 12hrs. Is this correct.

~~And you have~~ which is a sedative and used in anaesthesia.

Q Can you now tell me why you chose to give 20mg of Midazolam <sup>our 12hrs</sup> 10 times to previous dose which as a start dose made her unresponsive for 12hrs? of 2mg.

Q Would you agree that 20mg would render my Mother into a induced coma? in view of her previous reaction to this drug.

Would you agree?

Q And repeating this dose together, with each day 40mg Diamorphine - the induced coma over 4 days would then obviously lead to an induced death?

Q We have heard that she did not regain consciousness again and therefore would be unable to have any nourishment. Is this correct.

Q And is it correct to say as she had been deeply asleep / unconscious from 17th - 21st she had had no nourishment whatsoever during this time?

Q ~~Do~~ Do you agree that not to seek another opinion as to the cause ~~of~~ of my Mother's pain ~~and just to wait~~ and treatment for that cause - and just to use pain relief was not in the best interests of my Mother - your patient

- Q Your letter to Commander Scott says  
 "Thank you for taking the lady who  
Fell last night etc.  
 This is not correct is it?"
- Q Would you agree this looked  
 better than admitting she had fallen  
 at 1pm lunchtime - and nothing  
 was done about it?
- Q Would you agree that Nurses away  
 or off duty, coming back to the ward or  
 on the ward for the 1st time - would  
 read the comment made on this lady's  
 admission by you? I am happy for  
 nursing staff to confer death & then  
 look at the drug regime, write on  
 this ~~the~~ admission and think this lady  
must be very ill and dying, as  
 opposed to, a patient for rehabilitation  
 and to improve her already moribund  
 status?
