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New Bishop set to be enthroned on Sunday

THE NEW Bishop of Chichester will be enthroned on Sunday.

Dr Martin Warner will be inaugurated in a ceremony at Chichester Cathedral from 3.30pm.

He was appointed in May after the outgoing bishop, John Hind, retired in April after 11 years in the role

The 53-year-old keen cyclist, described as a traditionalist, said: 'It is a daunting and exciting challenge to be asked to serve the people of Sussex as the next Bishop of Chichester. I look forward very much to learning more about the mission in which we shall be engaging together.'

In September he spoke out saying lessons must be learned from the Archbishop of Canterbury's damning report on child abuse within the Chichester Diocese, saying: 'We have much to learn from all that has happened and must be humble in doing so, accepting our failures, responding with honesty and penitence, and demonstrating proper and appropriate engagement with those who are the victims of criminal and sub-Christian behaviour.'

'No surprise' as delay inquest announced

Daughter told more time is needed to find suitable venue

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A DAUGHTER who won the right to have an inquest heard into her mother's death at a hospital has been told the hearing is to be delayed.

After campaigning for 14 years, Gillian MacKenzie was due to attend an inquest into the death of her mother, Gladys Richards, next month.

It was set for December 3, but now will not take place until next year.

The Portsmouth coroner's office told her it needs to find a more suitable venue which has better facilities for the hard of hearing and to cope with the large number of people Mrs MacKenzie says

After relentless campaigning, the then Home Secretary Jack Straw granted an inquest in January 2009.

due to take place on December 12, with an announcement of the new inquest date to be given afterwards.

As previously reported in The News, Mrs Richards was taken to the Royal Haslar Hospital after she suffered a fall in Glen Heather's care home. After an operation, Mrs Richards was transferred to Gosport War Memorial Hospital, in Bury Road, for rehabilitation. During the course of her treatment she was given painkillers.

She died under the care of Dr Jane Barton.

Following Mrs ards' death, her daughter approached police concerns over her mother's care. It was this case that prompted an investigation by Hampshire Constabulary into deaths at the hospital.

Inquests into the deaths of five other patients at the hospital took place in 2009.

A jury ruled that drugs prescribed by Dr Barton contributed to the deaths.



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
