Dear Sir/Madam

My late aunt, Mrs Dulcie Middleton, died in Gosport War Memorial and her death was one of several at the hospital investigated by Hampshire Constabulary.

Mrs Middleton's daughter, Mrs M Bulbeck, has been corresponding with yourselves since the complaint against Hampshire Constabulary was taken over by yourselves on 1 April 2004.

Unfortunately, the trauma and stress that followed her mother's death and the subsequent investigations had a disastrous effect on Mrs Burbeck and she suffered a heart attack and I have been assisting her for some time whilst keeping the correspondence in her name.

I am in receipt of all correspondence from all parties involved in this matter and in particular the correspondence with yourselves.

I wish to place on record my total lack of confidence in yourselves and your ability to efficiently investigate the complaint against Hampshire Constabulary.

In addition, if you care to re-read the letters you have sent to Mrs Burbeck, you make statements as to actions you propose to make and then fail to take the actions stated; you refer to matters which imply you have already written to Mrs Burbeck when you have not and you have the arrogance to make further arrangements regarding this failed investigation prior to having the courtesy to inform the complainants of the errors that have been made and which you hope to avoid in the future.

I have no confidence in your ability to conclude this investigation in an efficient fair and impartial manner and I hereby request that you inform the Home Office of my concerns as to your ability and I would request that the Home Office investigate the manner in which you have allowed this matter to proceed. There is only one word to describe your attitude to complainants and your efficiency and the word is "lamentable".

Please confirm that you have addressed my concerns and request to the Home Office for an investigation into your actions.
