This patient who was admitted 2 months ago with a non Q-wave myocardial infarction was reviewed on 8 July 1998. She is keeping generally well but continues to have niggles of chest pain with an ache in both her arms and some shortness of breath.

On examination, pulse 80/min, blood pressure 140/80 mmHg.

She had just had an exercise ECG. The standard ECG showed no abnormalities, but significant ST segment depression was rapidly produced in infero-lateral leads at a workload of only 3 METs and at 93% of the target heart rate. She also experienced a heavy feeling in her chest and arms. This was a very positive test result at a very low workload.

She continues on treatment with Aspirin 75mgs daily and Isosorbide Mononitrate 20mgs bd. I have advised her to see you for a prescription for Atenolol and recommend initially 25mgs daily.

I am writing to Dr John Watkins, Consultant Cardiologist asking if he will consider her for coronary angiography. She will be reviewed here in 4 months.
