Between November 1992 and March 1993 I was Medical Officer (SHO grade) in General Medicine at Khartoum Teaching Hospital.

Between September 1993 and August 1995 I was Oversees Trainee/Honorary SHO in Histopathology at Southampton University Hospital.

Between September 1995 and October 1996 I was Locum Registrar in Histopathology at St Georges Hospital London and Queen Alexandra Hospital Portsmouth.

Between October 1996 and January 2002 I was Specialist Registrar in Rotation in Histopathology, Guy's Hospital and St Thomas's Hospital London and Queen Alexandra Hospital Portsmouth.

My original plan had been to gain Consultant Level qualification and return to the Sudan, however due to a change in personal circumstances and a growing dissatisfaction with the isolated nature of pathology practice, where I missed patient contact; I decided to change to General Practice.

Between February and August 2002 I was GP Registrar at Stoneham Lane Surgery in Southampton.

Between September 2002 and January 2003 I was GP Registrar at Nightingale Practice in Romsey.

Between February and August 2003 I was SHO in Obstetrics and Gynaecology at St Mary's Hospital Portsmouth.

Between August and October 2003 I did an Elective Period as an SHO in Dermatology, Ophthalmology and Rheumatology in Portsmouth NHS Trust.

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Between November 2003 and January 2004 I was GP Registrar at Portsdown Group Practice in Purbrook, Portsmouth.

Between February and August 2004 I was SHO in Psychiatry at St James's Hospital Portsmouth.

Between 9th August 2004 and present I am GP Registrar at Stoneham Lane Surgery Southampton.

My Histopathology experience includes

Autopsies: The post mortem of Community death, Hospital death, Suicidal death and Perinatal death.

Surgical Pathology: Dealing with small biopsies and major resections.

Cytopathology: this includes performing Fine Needle Aspiration and diagnostic laboratory work including cervical cytology.

Thave attended several Coroners' court inquests in Portsmouth, giving evidence based on post mortem findings, their interpretation and formulation of the cause of death. Other inquests dealt with suicidal and accidental death.

In my capacity as a pathologist I conducted a coroners post mortem on Arthur CUNNINGHAM born Code A at Queen Alexandra Hospital on 2/10/98. A death certificate had been issued which included bronchopneumonia and Parkinson's disease as the cause of death. However, Mr CUNNINGHAM's stepson disputed these causes and requested a post mortem to which the Coroner agreed.

I do not recall this post mortem but I produce a Portsmouth Pathology Service Autopsy Report

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on the body of Mr CUNNINGHAM exhibit no (YH/1).

The cause of death was bilateral bronchopneumonia.

My remarks are as follows" The deceased suffered from clinical Parkinsonism for several years. This was complicated by dementia which had juperdised management. He had been immobile and bed ridden, and consequently developed a sacral bed ulcer. Immobile and bed ridden patients are also known to be prone to bronchopneumonia, an infection which has led to the death of the deceased. In my opinion death was due to natural causes."

Any disease leading to death is deemed to be a natural cause.

Unnatural causes of death include Homicide, Suicide and Accident.
