The Independent on Sunday reports on the fitness to practise hearing of Dr Jane Barton. The article is critical that the hearing has been adjourned until next year.

The Sunday Mail reports on Dr Aniansson, the cosmetic surgeon who operated on Denise Hendry and has paid out £750,000 for botched operations. The doctor has returned to work in Stockholm following Denise Hendry's death. The article notes that the doctor voluntarily removed himself from the GMC register in 2003 which means he cannot work in the UK, but the move means he escaped a professional investigation and can still work abroad.

The General Medical Council faced growing condemnation last night after relatives of 12 elderly patients who died at a Hampshire hospital more than 10 years ago were told that they must wait until next year to find out whether the doctor in question will be struck off. Dr Jane Barton was last week found guilty of widely prescribing powerful painkillers and sedatives to elderly patients under her care at Gosport War Memorial Hospital which were "inappropriate, hazardous and not in their best interests".
