May I refer to your recent correspondence with Assistant Chief Constable WATTS in respect of the proposed meeting with myself to discuss the police investigation into the death of your late step-father Arthur CUNNINGHAM and apologise for the delayed response due to a 'leave' commitment.

I understand that you have asked that Mr CUNNINGHAM'S next of kin be notified of the prospect of such a meeting with a view to inviting their attendance.

I regret to inform you that Operation ROCHESTER do not have details of other family members upon the basis that they did not fall into the evidential chain. You seem to have exclusively dealt with matters at the time of Arthur's death as the nominated next of kin.

You remain the single family member forwarding relevant information in respect of Mr CUNNINGHAM'S medical and personal history, additionally useful information was gleaned from Mr CUNNINHAM'S domestic helper Mrs Shirley SELLWOOD.

The evidential papers considered by the CPS otherwise consisted of expert witnesses in respect of palliative care, medical oncology and geriatric care, Mrs CUNNINGHAMS GP and a range of healthcare professionals dispensing assessment and care towards your stepfather during the months leading to his death including:-
