I would have explained the procedure, ie, what we were going to do to Mrs DEVINE, I have recorded that Pt (patient) happy. I have then initialled this entry but appear to have carried it on by writing.

?Frusemide this am.

Here I was questioning whether the patient had taken any Frusemide (a water tablet) that morning I was going to check with her daughter-in-law (d in l) as the patient was unsure.

Her blood pressure was 150/85, slightly raised, her daughter in law was unavailable to ask about her medication but a letter had been sent prior to the test basically giving instructions regarding the taking of medication prior to the test. But I have no recollection of the details of this letter.

Tablets were left for pt, I have made further enquiries with the patient to make sure that she had taken her medication that morning and she told me that someone left the tablets out for the patient and that she had taken a little tablet. I recorded this and added probably ok, Frusemide is a very small tablet ∴ carry on with trial. Bases clear, I would have examined Mrs DEVINE and I had found that her lungs were clear, ie, no evidence of fluid in the lungs. I again have initialled this entry.

1400 refers to the time and my assessment of the patient after the test. I have recorded BP has ↓ 100/60, her blood pressure dropped. Pt feels fine, I would have enquired with the patient how she felt and that would have been her reply. I have arrowed from the entry regarding her blood pressure to ∴ do not give new medicine but keep in DH. Bring in to see RFL on 17/3 ? start.

Due to the drop in the patient's blood pressure after the ACE inhibitor test (I prescribed the ACE inhibitor tablets, at that time you had to write the prescription early so that by the time the patients were due to go home they had been prescribed by the pharmacy and arrived at the day hospital). I didn't want to give the
