Dear Mrs Harcourt,

I write further to my letter of the 20<sup>th</sup> September 2004, regarding the issues you raised in your earlier letter of the 12<sup>th</sup> September 2004.

I have reviewed the conclusions of the clinical team and our independent medical/legal advisor. These conclusions were based on the analysis of your father's medical records and the information provided by yourself.

Their view is that the treatment of your father was indeed sub-optimal, but not sufficient to consider that there had been unlawful criminal activity in respect of this treatment. Our investigation from the onset has been to identify if any criminal offences have been committed and if so, by whom.

Having studied the material available, the various experts have identified the key aspects of your father's treatment and on the basis that it cannot be considered to be unlawful criminal activity, we have consequently referred your father's case to the General Medical Council (GMC).



Dear Sir,

Thank you for your letter dated 6/9/04.

I wish to protest the conclusion that whilst my father was given 'sub optimal' treatment there will be no futher police action.

My father was injected with what turned out to be a lethal dose of Diamorphine.

The facts are that he was admitted to Haslar Hospital for Gall Bladder surgery which was successful, and because his wife (my mother) who was in her eighties was unable to cope with his convalescence in their one bed flat, he was admitted to the War Memorial for convalescence.

Though he was a late onset diabetic, his medication for that problem was withheld.

This resulted in a deteriation in his circulation and an ulcerated heel. The pain killers were administered to help relieve the pain.

I was later phoned at home to give the hospital permission to inject morphine but I would not give that permission.

They then asked my mother and I suppose she gave permission in complete ignorance of the probable outcome.

Another serious problem is that they lied on his death certificate i.e. We visited him daily and apart from confusion probably brought about by the lack of diabetic medicine, there was no sign of senility, (which doesn't come on in a week) yet this was given as a cause of death.

The other condition noted on the certificate was pneumonia, but unless this came on overnight, it is a lie, as he was not suffering from chest pains, coughing or any other symptom associated with pneumonia.

The actual cause of death was an overdose of Diamorphine

I consider the recorded cause of death an insult to his memory and do not propose to drop the matter until this is changed.
