Operation Rochester

I am writing with regard to our meeting of the 7th of September. Firstly, I would like you to thank you for finding time in your busy schedule to meet with us. It was, I think, a useful meeting during which we were able to resolve a number of issues.

The following is a résumé of the key points of agreement:

You have previously been asked to provide quality assurance of the category 2 cases. This has been completed to a point but you now await some additional material to be provided by the police in order for this process to be finalized. We have undertaken to supply you with this material which consists of the conclusions of the Key Clinical team, including the work of Mrs Waters. We fully understand your work in respect of the remaining category 2 cases cannot be undertaken until you have access to this said material.

We discussed the urgency of this work and you undertook to have your findings with us as soon as reasonably possible. In any event, to have this said work with us in time for our Key Clinical Team (KCT) meeting on the 9^{th} - 10^{th} October 2004.

We discussed the work emanating from the work of Professor Baker. We agreed that this work should follow directly after you have concluded your analysis of the existing category 2 cases. Again, we would seek to have this work quality assured by you and with us by the above dates in October.

We asked, and you agreed to attend the KCT meeting on Sunday the 10^{th} in order to discuss certain issues that have arisen within your analysis of the category 2 cases

Once this category 2 work has been completed we agreed that you would commence analysis and quality assurance of the cases that fall into the category 3A.

We discussed your fees and verbally agreed that your charges would rise to £250 per hour and this higher rate will commence in respect of your analysis of the Baker cases and all new work commissioned thereafter, including for your attendance at the KCT meeting in October and the 3A analysis. All work being currently conducted will be paid at the existing rate. You agreed to supply me with a revised document in respect of the new rates of pay.
