Dear Dave

Here is my explanation:

"On examining the heart I found blockage disease on 2 out of the 3 arteries that supply the heart. This blockage disease is up to 80% of the tube circle, that is to say advanced disease. This disease will cause heart muscle death due to the lack of blood supply. The heart muscles showed evidence of past episodes of muscle death but no evidence to suggest a recent episode that would have caused death.

On examination of the lungs; both lungs were heavier than normal (normal is 300-500g at that age). The reason is that, air spaces were filled with fluid and the small airways filled with pus, because of inflammation due to infection. This will lead me to believe that; the cause of death is infection of the lungs, or in medical term: bronchopneumonia. This is present on both lungs (bilateral)"
