Emily Yeats explaining to Code A that she is still confused as to how the police investigation is proceeding. When she telephoned Hampshire Constabulary last week, asking for Steve Watts, she was told that she was told that he was no longer on the case. She is unsure who she spoke to, however it was somebody's PA. She then telephoned Readhead who told her Steve Watts was still on the case, and that they were to send all of information back to the CPS.

Emily feels as though everybody has had an interview except her family. There is so much information that she has discovered in the medical records that she wants is for somebody to sit down with her and go through the records and listen to her family's version of events in order that someone can say whether it is worth proceeding.

From for example, she recently noted that in the medical records, the diamorphine was not obtained from the pharmacy. It therefore appears to her that the hospital were stockpiling drugs. Emily considers that this information should be made known to the police, but she is not being given the opportunity to do so.

Emily is also concerned that the police appear to be withholding information in the expert medical reports. If these reports are so weak as to not carry the case forward, then why can the families not see them?

Emily spoke to Owen Kenny last week, who informed her that the police are having informal meetings with everybody whom Code A had detailed, to inform them as to how the investigation is proceeding. Her family is still waiting to be informed about this meeting. Owen Kenny also mentioned that the police are considering a meeting with the families, and Emily would very much appreciate this as soon as possible.
