not responding to treatment

() taken to QA - quite poorly
3-4 days.- transferred to Daedulus ward, GWMH
- died 10 days later.- met her there + from then went downhill.
Every time, nothing for her to drink or
couldn't reach it herself.
no one was helping her.
- couldn't eat.() I asked nurse why she was going so
quickly downhill -

Yes she is

I said I didn't want her suffering.
we never saw a doctor the whole time.

Philip Bead - charge nurse.

() got phonecall ~~from~~ after 3 days - I went down
I spoke to Philip Bead - mum was deteriorating
nothing they could do for her - still never

saw a doctor.

- never agreed she was to go on syringe driver.

- notes say Philip Bead asked ~~me~~
Code A for permission to use syringe driver.
 - she never said that.

not in any pain ^{at all till last day,} - she looked as though she
 was in pain / distress - I had to find the
 ward sister ~~1/2 hr later~~, waited
 50 mins for Philip Bead.

- Called I
 usual chirp self. - thought he was in
 for rehab + replacement for Addenbrooke
 as no nursing care.

went down + down hill.

Philip Bead said "we'll give her something
 to make her comfortable" he said
 she'd look like

Philip B said to Emily's sister "your
 mother seems to think you're grandmother's
 in some sort of pain."

→ diamorphine - written up by Dr Barton

catheter was full of blood.

1. pneumonia reg'd by Dr Barton
 " senile dementia

Thursday night. day before she died.

- 8 pm, she'd been put on syringe driver between 3 pm + 8 pm. She knew nothing about it she was completely unconscious.

30 mg diam. } per day. x 2
30 mg medonaki.

- we stayed all night by her bed

6 am - they came in + gave wash - never saw anyone again til late morning, + Dr Barton (who we didn't know then) came round, she opened the curtains + said "it won't be long now."

- first + last time we saw Dr B
- about 4 pm, PBead told us to go home + have a rest
- I didn't want to go, but ~~they~~^{he} persuaded me.

At 6:30 pm, Emily + I went back to hosp, we walked towards the ward + as we saw him + we ran into the room by her bed + said "oh, she just died".

- I can't believe that that happened.

PBead confirmed death on notes.

- 6:30 pm - daughter + family present.

In med rec - 10th - 21st - nothing to ~~say~~ say a doctor came to see her.

- post-mortem: nothing mentioned
in ~~the~~ at all.

- queried senile dementia + pneumonia
with Registrar. - Gosport Registry office
Reg. Järvi said "Oh, they often put that"

- We were upset, trying to arrange funeral,
didn't want to upset the girls.

never contemplated anything negligent

- never contemplated any criminality.

- didn't think much of Philip Bead's attitude
following death - ~~mother~~ didn't see anyone
else -

body taken to chapel.

- saw it in paper last year in 2000

- rang police - spoke to **Code A**
took details + said they'd investigate +
contact back in 2 mths.

few months passed, I phoned back +
he said he'd got the files from hosp.

few mths later, I rang back + **Code A**
had taken over + ~~he~~ said they weren't
taking it any further

- he came here - said PCs had been sent to expert
medical + report said there was:

- level of sub-standard care +
level of drugs given.

reasons for not continuing :-

lack of police resources,
didn't want to cause unnecessary anxiety
to other families

" it is not a question of murder as no
monetary gain such as H Shipman "

- tried to get expert med. opinion
medical insurers objected to disclosure
we were told can't see them.

lodged formal complaint against John
Code A - he kept riling me after
I lodged complaints.

I phoned PCA + asked whether **Code A** should
be riling me after lodging formal
complaint - they said no

- I wrote to CC to say **Code A** was still
riling.

Code A rang me again after that.

Code A told us not to pay roads of
money to sol's to obtain med. opinion
as he said he'd do everything we can to
help us.

Code A - met him urgently on ferry
to tell us Code A had been promoted

Following complaint re Code A Code A
came round to his book comment

Following formation of group,
support worker told me its w/ the CPS. ^{but in work}
I rang Code A + went ballistic &
Code A told me to write to CC expressing
concern re ^{lack} communication.
- got reply from CC.

- 1st left meeting.
- See minutes of meeting in file.
- Gillman's case }
Clacker report }
4 med opinions }
CAI report }

Spoke to Code A - not enough evidence
not worth paper its written on.

- got phone call saying document had
come to light during back to '91.

Formal complaint to GMC

+ Nursing + midwifery council

- GMC - Dr Lord was completely exonerated

prima facie evid. against Dr B
prelim disc hearing

- charges would def be serious professional misconduct. (28/29 Aug - heard dates)

→ GMC told me that's been postponed till after crim. investigation.

- NMC - "lost files"

letter - prelim board July

phoned on day - adjourned coz too many docs recovered 24th Sept - phoned again

Code A

- all adjourned pending outcome of crim. investigation.

It was told Dr B will be charged w/ serious prof misconduct, but they can't suspend him. I said I had serious concerns about him, but
