Dear Ms Docherty,

Thank you for your letter of the 12th June 2002 in response to my letter to Ian Piper, but unfortunately this just is not good enough, and has once again has shown me the incompetence within your care trust.

I do not accept your somewhat vague explanation with regards the mix up in names and address of my late father and myself, and how the answer to my question goes back to the very early days of this new organisation, you make it sound like an age away when in fact it is only 72 days, this adds to my view that you are indeed an incompetent organisation, after such a short time in existence.

You say, which for some reason you are unable to explain, my fathers name was given as being a relative and not as one of the deaths being investigated. This again is unbelievable, I want you to investigate fully and then to explain how, considering the circumstances of my fathers death, you can make this blatant mistake.

I have been in contact with the former trust on a number of occasions since April 2001, in fact Lesley Humphrey has written to me on five separate occasions, Sue Scannell has also written to me, and in fact Lesley Humphrey contacted Max Millett on my behalf. This has all been to my address and has at no time been directed to my fathers former address.

The only letters that has been addressed to my fathers former address, other than Ian Pipers two, was by Lesley Humphreys to my fathers former wife, if you had taken the time or the trouble to have checked you would have noticed that it was because I was trying to obtain permission from my fathers former wife, for access to my fathers medical records, and from this letter it was fairly clear that there was friction between myself and my fathers former wife.

This leads me to my final point, I do not believe that anybody, including you, would refer to their mother as 'my fathers former wife,' Having personally asked many people if they would mistake that particular phrase as a reference to someone's mother, they all agreed that no, they would not and, at a guess, it was obviously a reference to a subsequent partner.

Mrs Gillian Kimbley, nee Wilson, is my fathers second wife, is obviously not my mother, I am appalled by your thoughtless assumptions.

You have those details on file, they are mentioned in my fathers medical records, and I personally have been in contact with the NHS trust on many occasions. All you have done is add insult to injury.

I said in my earlier letter that I did not want a grovelling apology, I note your comment that you are truly sorry for the mistake that you made, you finish by asking me to imagine your deep embarrassment. As I have earlier said I'm not interested in apologies and I don't care for a second with regard your embarrassment.

I do not expect this blatant disrespect to continue.
