[Code A] engaged in receiving a telephone call from [Code A]. He asked whether he could arrange an appointment time with [Code A] for the meeting on Tuesday 27th April. It was agreed that [Code A] should attend at 6.30 p.m.

[Code A] asked whether he had any specific queries that he needed to be raised with the police. He explained that his father's case had fallen into category 2. He was wondering what should happen next as in his opinion if, after being seen by the experts, they were unable to reach a decision, he could not understand what further information could be gathered.

[Code A] explained that she would pass his comments onto [Code A] for the meeting with the police.

[Code A] then engaged in discussing his father's case in general. He explained that he would like to know what happened to his father and he still feels guilty as he was the person who gave the hospital permission to administer his father with diamorphine. [Code A] explained it was not his fault and he is not a medically qualified person and could not be expected to reasonably give such advice.

[Code A] was also concerned about the issue of costs. [Code A] explaining that they are currently conducting these cases on a pro bono basis and he would not be liable for any costs, if this was to ever change he would be given plenty of prior notice. He asked on what basis these cases might run, could they possibly be a no win no fee agreement. [Code A] explaining that he should draw a distinction between a civil and a criminal claim, criminal claim is a case which is taken by the state against an individual, a civil claim would be an individual against another individual and at this stage it is very difficult to see if it would be possible for [Code A] to bring a civil claim. [Code A] asking what funding options would be available to him if he brought a civil claim, [Code A] explaining there is a variety of options depending on the circumstances of the case but did not think it was necessary to discuss these at this stage as the police investigation was still ongoing.
