Dear Anne

Sorry my letter is late reaching you, we do have some questions we would like you to ask the police. Starting with the first, we have still got my fathers clothing that he was wearing on the day he died at the hospital. I telephoned the police to inform them and ask if they would like to pick them up and have them forensically tested. But I was amazed to hear that they would not do this, please could you find out from the police exactly what evidence they need to prove that our father was overdosed.

On September 11 2003, we attended a meeting at police head quarters Netley. When we were told that professor Forest had concluded his findings and there were causes of concern in some of the cases. We were told that we would be put into three categories, and at a later date what one of these we would be in. Kate Robinson then contacted us to arrange to sign a consent form to release my father's medical file from Haslar. So is it right to understand that professor Forest did not see the medical file before he came to his findings. If he did not see the file, how could he come to the conclusion regarding my fathers death. Could you then find out if professor Forest has since seen the medical file from Haslar, and re-investigated the case. Kate Robinson told us that the medical experts had picked up, that the Haslar notes were missing. Which leads us to believe that they were not looked at in the first instance. We do feel that this is incompetence by the police not to have all the medical evidence together to be investigated.

After a telephone conversation with Owen Kenny, I was told that we would not be told any more about the case until the summer at least. We as a family are very distraught that after nearly FOUR YEARS we are still no further forward in this case. We are tired of hearing the same things over and over again. We just want justice done and it seems that the harder we push the further back we go. Its taken us many years of pain and anguish trying to bring those responsible for the sudden death of our father, how much longer do we have to suffer the waiting until justice is done.
