This is a record of my telephone message with Ian Wilson, a complainant in this case. His father died at the hospital. [Code A] passed me his number [Code A] and I called him back at 14:25.

I asked him to confirm the identity of the people he was complaining about and the name of the hospital. He confirmed it as Gosport War Memorial Hospital and that he had complained about [Code A] and now also knew the other nurses in the case were called [Code A]

Mr Wilson asked what action was being taken.

I began by explaining that the NMC was monitoring the progress of another body's proceedings and we would be writing to him in due course. He interrupted me and asked if I meant the GMC. I explained that I did. He said that he did not want the NMC to await the outcome of the GMC's proceedings. He had seen a 78 page statement by [Code A] [Code A] which proved that she was responsible for the murder of his father. Nothing appeared to have been done.

I explained that this was not the case but before I could continue he said that he wanted action taken against [Code A] "before she died" and hoped that this would "stir us into action". He added that unless he got satisfaction he would go to press, with whom he had developed a good relationship.

I said I would not his comments and he terminated the call. [ends]
