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## Code A

The Council has received allegations of misconduct from Mr Page and Code A which may lead to the removal of your name from the register.

Misconduct is defined in the Nurses, Midwives and Health Visitors (Professional Conduct) Rules 1993 as "conduct unworthy of a registered nurse, midwife or health visitor, as the case may be, and includes obtaining registration by fraud".

The allegations are stated as follows:

That you, while employed as a staff nurse at Redcliffe Annex and Dryad Ward, Gosport War Memorial Hospital,

- 1. On dates from 27 February to 3 March 1998, failed to act in the interests of Patient D (Eva Page).
- 2. On an unknown date in November 1999, failed to provide the family of Patient E (Elsie Devine) with any explanation about her medication;
- 3. On or around 19 November 1999, failed to adequately account to Patient E's family for her sudden deterioration.

In accordance with the Rules mentioned above the Council's Preliminary Proceedings Committee will consider the matter on **11 and 12 April 2010**. Please find enclosed copies of documents relating to the allegation which the Committee will receive. These are as follows:

- Report by the in-house legal team;
- Schedule of documentation;
- Bundle of documentation.

In the course of its proceedings, the NMC has also obtained the following information:

The papers in the bundle disclose confidential information that identifies patients or clients. Such confidential information is sent to you for the sole purpose of responding to the allegation(s). You should not disclose it to anyone except your representative or any witness who needs it to provide a statement about the allegation. If you disclose confidential information for the purposes described above, you must advise those people of their duty to protect that information. Failure to take proper steps to protect patient or client confidentiality may result in another allegation against you.

If the Committee considers that the allegations may lead to removal, it will issue a Notice of Proceedings and invite you to respond in writing to the Notice. In this event the case will be listed to come back to the Committee for a second consideration in the light of any response you may make to the Notice. However, it is open to you to make a preliminary written response to the allegations at this stage, and any letter you write will be made available to the Committee at its first consideration of the case. Any such response should reach the Council's offices by **9 April 2010**.
