DETERMINATION ON FINDINGS OF FACT relating to my step-father, and remains unreplied by your office even though receipt was acknowledged.
Your correspondence of 20 July was a response to my report to you of the appalling evidence I had just heard during the GMC hearing from Nurses [Code A] and not related to my step-father's case at all.
I would now like your response specifically to the nursing of my step-father, Mr Cunningham, whilst in the care of the staff at the GWMH.
I am aware that the NMC will hold the papers passed by Hampshire police in 2006 relating to their enquiries, but no action seems to have resulted from that, and would suggest that these might be helpful.
