Dear Mr Horsley,

May I ask three quick questions?

I understand that there are to be GMC hearings in June which relate to events at Gosport War Memorial Hospital. I wouldn't expect you to comment on that, but if that's the plan I'd have thought it unlikely that the hearing could go ahead unless the inquest into the death of Gladys Richards has taken place. As that is in your area of responsibility, may I ask if you are able to give any indication of when that inquest might take place?

Secondly, it would also be very helpful to know if Mrs Richards' inquest will be heard by a jury. It is significant from our point of view, because it will determine what restrictions apply to our reporting. If there is to be a jury then the reporting restrictions imposed by the Contempt Of Court Act already apply, as procedings are active in Mrs Richards' case. WE are keen to avoid any issues of contempt, and would appreciate your guidance on this.

Thirdly, I have been told that there are likely to be further 'group' inquests in respect of deaths at Gosport War Memorial Hospital. Is that right?
