Since her husband was undergoing bilateral knee amputations at the Royal Haslar Hospital it was decided to transfer them both to the Gosport War Memorial Hospital so that they could be together as Mrs Williamson did not have long to live.

The last thing Mrs Williamson asked was what was wrong with her as she felt a fraud being in hospital as she wasn't in any pain. A nurse then informed the family that they would make her comfortable. She was then put on a syringe driver device, which totally knocked her out, she didn't speak again and you could hear her lungs filling up with liquid. Until she died.

Mr Williamson eventually underwent bilateral below knee amputations on 18 August 2000 following which he was transferred to Gosport War Memorial Hospital for rehabilitation and, moreover, to be with his wife who was there having recently been diagnosed with cancer.

He was communicative, reading and generally taking an interest in his family. The nurse said to the family that they would make Mr Williamson comfortable like they did for Mrs Williamson. Mr Williamson was put on a syringe driver device.

to follow.  
 Failure of hospital procedures lead to gross neglect - no fluid or food charts completed, absence of medical notes & information. Serious lack of communications between nurses and consultant. Failure to listen to the family.

ACP engaged in two very long telephone conversation with Mrs Gillian McKenzie. She called in twice to say that she is unable to get the questionnaire forms into us today. She wanted to speak to John White but I explained that he was busy at present. The forms are in Eastbourne and she is not able to make the trip. She wanted to know if we could go through these over the phone. I said that that was not possible; she needed to get it to us in the post. She went on to describe her case to me in detail but she was not very coherent and clearly upset that her case had not been listed. From what I can understand she does not want to fill in the forms if the Coroner already has an account of her story. I advised that we really did need the questionnaire as we are collating information from a couple of relatives and need something in easy format to put before the coroner tomorrow. She says that she will call Peter Walsh and see what he recommends. She does not want to fill in any more unnecessary paperwork if there is no guarantee that the coroner will take on her case. She does not want to incur any more legal costs and advised that she was dissatisfied with the service she was receiving from her current solicitors. She will wait to hear from Mr Walsh.
