There are considerable data at Gwent H, and the immediate challenge is to make best use of them. The centrally provided stats will take some time to obtain.

The data from mico countfields disclose a pattern with a variety of explanations. The most likely involves the new hospital cohorts / number of beds / care mix.

The Dayad admissions book may throw some light on this.

The Arqys books also require analysis, although there are numerous. There are, I think records.

It is important to note that no doctor has issued 2 MCCOs during 2001, & the banning from cars for patients in Gwent H would appear appropriate until the explanation for current findings is clear.

The available data would be inadequate to make a case for full suspension (very easily challenged), and don't point to useful lines of enquiry for the police. No additional data collected from Dayad work admissions book, or scanning, does suggest changes in admission policies/practices may be the explanation.
