How you can help us - checklist

- Is your home easy to identify in the dark? Leaving a hall light on will help the Night Nurse find you.
- Decide where the Night Nurse is to sit, this could be at the patient's bedside or in a room nearby. A comfortable chair for the Night Nurse to use will be necessary.
- A reading lamp will be needed if the overhead light is not to be used. Notes will need to be written so a good light will be necessary.
- Leave the notes left by your District Nurse ready.
- Please make available any medication in prescribed container that may need to be given during the night.
- The temperature drops in the night, it would helpful if there was some form of heating for the Night Nurse if necessary.
- The Night Nurse will be happy to discuss any problems or worries you may have.
- Please explain your security arrangements, in case of an emergency.
- Portsmouth HealthCare Trust operates a No Smoking Policy.



NIGHT NURSING SERVICE

Aim

The Night Nursing Team is part of the Community Nursing Service offering nursing care, advice and support for patients and their carers.

Who are the Night Nurses?

The team consists of both Registered Nurses and Health Care Support Workers employed by Portsmouth HealthCare NHS Trust.

When are our Services available?

 Seven nights a week depending upon assessed need and availability
From 10.00 pm to 7.00 am or at other times by agreement.

What do we do?

- Offer skilled nursing care during the night, following the agreed Care Plan, allowing the carer a much needed good night's rest.
- Give continuing support and reassurance to patients and carers.
- Teach and advise patients and carers.
- Offer specialist skills for care of the dying.

ABOUT US

The Community Home Loans service is jointly funded by the Health Commission and Social Services.

OUR AIM

The aim of the service is to provide a comprehensive loan system of personal homecare aids to residents of the Portsmouth and South East Hants District.

Your needs will then be assessed and the appropriate equipment will be requested on your behalf.

USE OF EQUIPMENT

The equipment that is on loan is designed to help you to live more comfortably at home. If an item of equipment is found to be inappropriate or difficult to use, do let us know immediately so that alternative arrangements can be made.

RETURN OF EQUIPMENT

As all our equipment is in constant demand, we request that equipment is returned to us as soon as it is no longer required. We operate a recall system which enables us to confirm that equipment on loan is still required.

HOW TO RETURN ITEMS NO LONGER REQUIRED

They may be returned to either our store, which is based in the grounds of St James' Hospital on Monday to Friday between the hours of 8.00 am - 12.00 midday and 2.00 - 4.00 pm. Saturday and Sunday 9.00 am - 10.00 am.

or

Any local Health Centre or Social Services Area Centre. Please ensure that the name and address of the user of the equipment is attached.


In the event of either of the above not being possible, we should be advised that the equipment is no longer required so that we can make necessary arrangements to collect the items.

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
