#### National media focus

- On 15 July the Guardian reported on Government plans to place GP practices in special measures if they are found to have failed their patients
- On 24 July the <u>BBC</u> carried a report that nineteen NHS trusts have been referred to ministers after auditors raised concerns about their financial health. The number represents nearly a four-fold rise from five last year.
- On 25 July the <u>HSJ</u> reported on a Labour party warning that mental health patients are facing an alarming postcode lottery in services.
- On 29 July the <u>HSJ</u> reported that hospitals will get the chance to check and challenge plans to cut emergency admissions drawn up for the government's £3.8bn better care fund. This was revealed in new Department of Health guidance.

#### The local health economy

- On 10 July University Hospital Southampton NHS FT celebrated the opening of a £700,000 upgrade to birthing facilities at the Princess Anne Hospital
- On Friday 11 July Amanda Barnes, divisional head of nursing and professions at University Hospital Southampton NHS Foundation Trust, was among 50 women named in the Health Service Journal's list of the most inspirational women in healthcare.
- Solent NHS Trust has been rated second out of 25 care trusts countrywide for recruiting people to take part in clinical trials and research studies. The league table was published by the National Institute for Health Research Clinical Research Network.
- On 28 July the councils of governors of both Heatherwood and Wexham Park Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust (HWPH) and Frimley Park Hospital NHS Foundation Trust (FPH) announced that they have agreed to support the acquisition of HWPH by FPH. The FPH Board is now in final discussions with the relevant public authorities. Once these discussions are concluded satisfactorily the trusts will be able to approach the foundation trust regulator Monitor formally for final approval.
- Jean Munday, an endocrine nurse specialist at Queen Alexandra Hospital nurse has been shortlisted in the Nursing Times Awards Nurse of the Year category.
